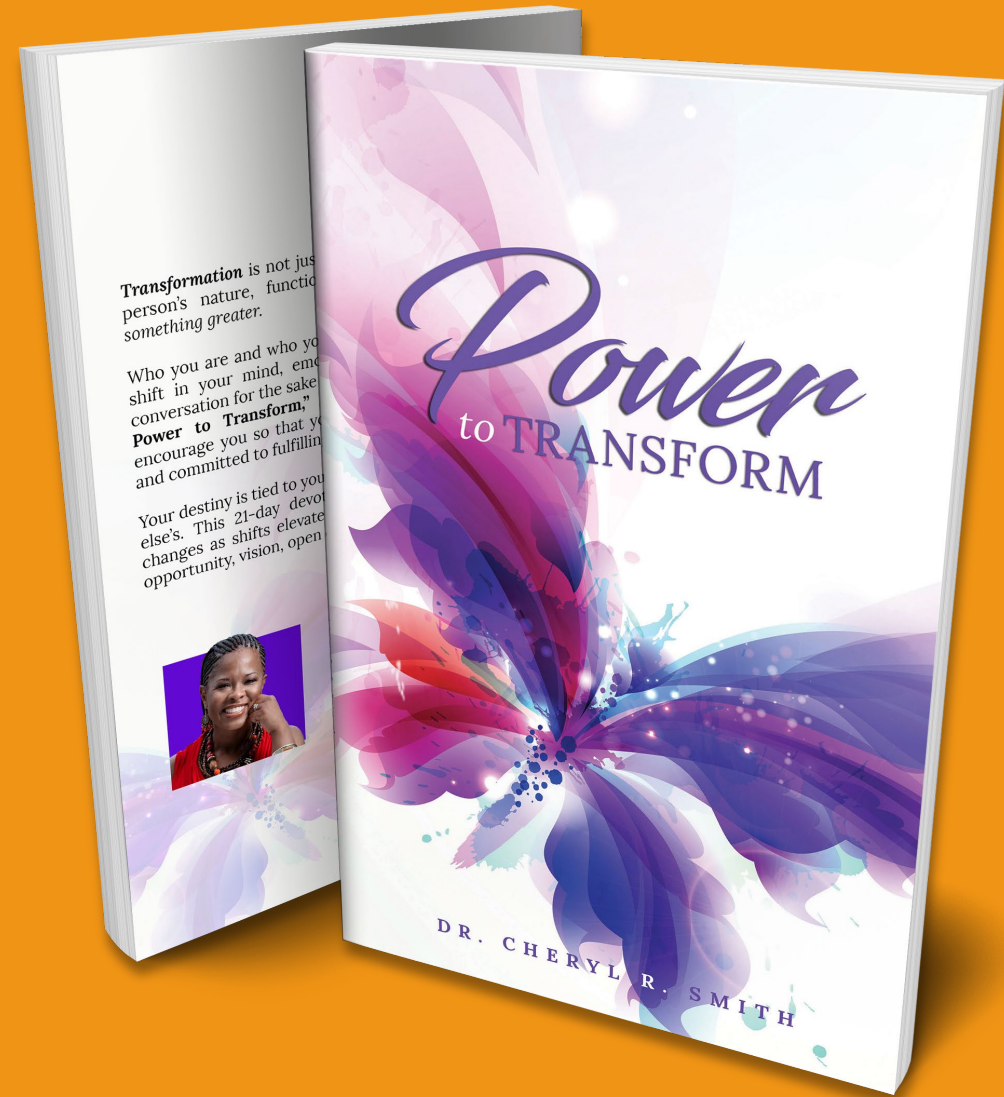

Key Points



Purpose will sometimes require you to stay still even in the midst of disappointment.



Your destiny and God's plan for your life is too great for you to make sudden or sporadic moves



Transformation requires us to keep moving even in the face of fear or doubt.

Key Points on Transformation in Isaiah 6:1-13



Isaiah 6:1 - “In the year King Uzziah died, I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne...”



Uzziah’s name means strength. So, in other words, when what I thought was strong died, that’s when I saw the Lord.



Transformation May Require Something to Die.



Transformation Changes Perspective.



Transformation Requires an Inward Look at Ourselves



Reflect: What in you has to “die” or cease to exist in order that you might see God and fulfill purpose? (Is it unforgiveness, low self-esteem, jealousy, negativity, anger, bitterness, anxiety, disappointment, frustration, complaining, etc.)

It is Not What It Seems!



It is a Faith-Based Decision.



It requires Deliverance.
